KMLD GREEN TEAM

"KMLD Green Team is a group of local people, engaging with the wider community, carrying out practical conservation work to improve wildlife, the landscape and the countryside in the parish of Kirkby Malzeard, Laverton & Dallowgill. All welcome".

After a well-attended meeting to discuss the <u>NYC Path Keepers Scheme</u> in the Mechanics inSeptember, 12 Green Team members spent the following Sunday afternoon walking a series of well-used footpaths close to the village, surveying for any improvements needed and clearing any overhanging

vegetation. This work is done by the group on behalf of NYC. We found a surprising lack of waymarkers, and that the official line of the right of way was not always the obvious one! We aim to follow up these initial Sunday afternoon "survey" walks by going out to improve waymarkers and offering to help farmers with improvements to stiles and gates where appropriate. We will also be following-up any reported issues sent through to us by NYC.



If anyone wants to get actively involved with the Path Keepers Group please let me know. Members were also keen to have a map reading & OS app training session, so this is something we plan to organise - watch this space.

Finally, Phil Bowe has offered to join Patrice & I and James & Su Wood on the organising committee, so thanks to him for stepping up!

Nature notes from Mickley November

What a late autumn....we still have lots of colour in the trees and shrubs especially field maple, hazel and cornus, although as usual the ashes are dark skeletons already. With the piles of leaves everywhere I always wonder where the humming bird hawk moth finds its pile of leaves to hibernate in; if you do not know it look it up, a real stunner in colour and design. And the butterfly numbers increased a lot in early October...phew! The European hornet nested in next door's roof, as they come out at night was a bit of a shock to see such a large bee like insect in one's bedroom!

Our garden birds were very quiet in early October, but in mid November they are all back. The hawthorn berries have gone already, some of the rowans are stripped as well. The mistle thrush has returned to mount guard over our Joseph Rock rowan trees that have orange berries. Last year the local thrushes had to defend the rowan berries vs the gorgeous waxwings that suddenly arrived at the end of November. So if northern Scandinavia is having a really cold time like -40C they will appear again. Jays have reappeared busily planting acorns and other nuts.

The barn owl has reappeared on the hill south of Mickley....hurrah! as not seen since the spring, the tawny owls are hooting away as usual, and short eared owls have been seen at Thornborough Henges. Wonderful..alongside about 500 curlews at Nosterfield in early November, Wensleydale being a hot spot for them. Whooper swans went overhead today on a clear blue sky, whooping as they were flying, such a lovely sight. Pink footed geese are already going overhead as well as greylags. The starling murmurations are starting too so hopefully they will congregate at Ripon Wetlands as spectacularly as in earlier years.

Meanwhile the more challenging side of having hens and large compost bins, ie Rats, are in great evidence. We put out a trap and killed a young wren. So back to bait temporarily as they have been trying to get into the hen feed. They have been unsuccessful as we put the hen feed bins in Alcatraz overnight, so the rats are seriously thwarted. The kestrel is back across the village no doubt too hoping to take food off the barn owl as the owl hunts the field voles. It promises to be an exciting raptor feed watch and so do avoid rodent bait use as the raptors are often poisoned through eating poisoned rodents.

Meanwhile the sparrow hawk keeps its 9.00 am hunting appointment most mornings on the birds feeding on the heavily defended feeders. Great tits are occasionally taken successfully for breakfast. Meantime buzzards wheel overhead in trios and the kestrels police the fields which are well dotted with vole/mice holes.

Moths remain fascinating, we have had 2 species, linked with woodland in serious decline, possibly due to our planting of trees and shrubs in quantity. Talking of which, we tend to leave the garden shrubs untrimmed until March to let the insects have a winter home, this year we have drilled holes in birch stumps and a vertical insect hotel awaits!

Plums and Custard

A lovely surprise was waiting for us in the wood, a large beautiful fungus -red in colour with strong yellow edges, we looked it up and yes, you've guessed right, it was plums and custard, no messing about with peaches and cream when these were given their name. It turned and folded and then another grew from the tree stump and kept us amused through the endless grey days that defined the end of October and dominated the beginning of November. But now! all that seems forgotten, swept away by a few days of clear blue skies and sunshine albeit with a nip in the air.

Good times for hedge cutting and oh so tidy our lanes and roads are looking.

Where there have been berries the thrushes have been busy, Fieldfares made quick work of any red treats on Marsden Well Road and for the last few days a strong group of Redwing have been foraging and flying in exuberant bursts and swoops from the higher hedges at the top of Sawley Moor Lane. The sheep and two groups of cows were all sitting down like toy models, as if having a well-deserved break from their busy task of eating grass, while a family of wrens fed freely in and out of the dry-stone walls.

At Picking Gill Nature Reserve we marked Armistice Day with a dedicated number from the village and beyond. It was peaceful and calm and only three cars on the Pateley Road invaded the silence briefly. Three days later and the digger was at work resculpting the ponds and, through the help of the Skell Valley, keeping within the site a wonderful wide and diverse range of habitats. The oaks are particularly impressive whether you look down on them from the top of the old quarry or up into their branches from the track below.
