Dear Friends,

‘Consider the lilies of the fields...’



I imagine that many of us will know by heart the opening line of the poem, *Leisure*, by the Welsh poet, William Henry Davies, first published in 1911? “What is this life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare?” How easy it is to get so overwhelmed with busyness and worry that we simply fail to make time to notice what’s right in front of us. I love this time of year, with many of our own flowers and shrubs in full bloom: the golden broom greeting us cheerily at one end of the front garden; the huge, dusky peonies, slim purple tulips and tall mauve *alliums*, just outside my study; and the great orangey-scarlet poppies alongside the drive. I’ve always loved rhododendrons, and was delighted when a neighbour proudly invited me into a back yard to see a beautiful specimen in full bloom – a well-established plant, of great sentimental value.

As I write, my wife, Jo, and I are preparing to lead a quiet day next week in our local *Himalayan Garden and Sculpture Park*, for a group of individuals from across the diocese. Hopefully, despite the heavy rains and recent easterly winds, there will still be some mature rhododendrons in full flower, even if the magnolias and azaleas might just be past their best. The aim of the day is simply to offer these people some space to reflect, amidst the palpable peace and glorious beauty of this ‘little piece of heaven’. Though

crafted lovingly over many years, and undergoing a continuous process of further planting and pruning – and with an annually-changing array of new sculptural exhibits, complementing the interesting permanent collection – it is easy to overlook, or indeed take for granted, this tranquil jewel of both natural- and crafted beauty, sitting right on our doorstep.

Yet, even there, it is possible to be so taken up with daily worries, and those things which niggle away at us, that we fail really to encounter the beauty immediately in front of us, or allow our thoughts to take us into awe and wonder at the creativity of the One who fashioned it all in the first place. The Apostle Paul tells us, via his letter to the fledgling church at Colossae, that Jesus is not only the '[visible] image of the invisible God', but that, 'all things have been created through him and for him'; reminding us also that, 'in him all things hold together'. His focus never wavers. Sometimes, we *can* relax... He's taking care of it *all*!

How amazing that Jesus should pay so much attention to the tiniest of flowers – along with the many insects needed to pollinate them! How much more attention must he be paying to us, the pinnacle of his creative work, particularly since he loved us so much that he would be willing to die for us – that our failings might be forgiven, and we discover our true freedom as the sons and daughters of the Living God! In his gospel account, Matthew records Jesus urging his contemporaries, despite the raw, financial and political instability of their daily existence, not to worry about the daily necessities of life – God will continue to provide those, if they will but trust Him each day. Let's allow the glorious flowers around us and the chattering little birds in our gardens, now busy raising their young, to act as living proof of God's unique creativity and daily reminders of His always-generous provision. Perhaps it would do us no harm to '*stand and stare*' a little more often?

Fountains Book Club

'Vianne' by Joanne Harris was our book for May and it is the prequel to the 'Chocolat' series. How much does your past affect your present-day self? Can you ever become a different version of yourself and ignore all you were previously taught? Is it possible to run from ourselves forever?

Questions such as these are raised in 'Vianne' as the reader is introduced to Sylviane Rochas who blows into Marseille and adopts the name of 'Vianne', one of many names she uses in her life. She is a young, single, pregnant

woman who has lived her life going 'where the wind takes her' (a phrase repeated throughout). This is the first part of her journey after her mum has died and left her completely alone. Their life together had been constantly on the move, living hand to mouth and never forming attachments or carrying belongings. She has been brought up fearing 'the man in black' and the reason for all their lifestyle is slowly revealed in the story. The book explains how she came to work with chocolate. The story follows Vianne as she tries to settle in Marseille and create some stability for her child and ignore her desire to keep moving. There is a continuous struggle between wanting to break away from her mother's beliefs and use of tarot cards and seeing into people/ghosts/memories and yet always returning to them. She meets a handful of people who all try to help her and offer her stability but she keeps rebuffing it. Throughout the story we also learn the background to these characters and how their past affects their present.

In general, the book received mixed reviews from being 'loathed' to really enjoyed. The opening is very sensuous and this evocative use of the senses is apparent throughout her writing. She has a good style of writing and some felt that the unbelievability of parts of the story could be forgiven because of the quality of the writing. For some the magic and mysticism in it did not sit comfortably but appreciated that it was part of Vianne's character and how it fitted into the story. An aspect that resonated with everyone is how objects and smells are used in the story as a source of memories. We could all relate to this as we have objects in our own lives that remind us of special people and that we feel closer to them when we use them. A warning, the book covers many themes including death, miscarriage, baby kidnapping and darker magic but they are not necessarily all focused on or developed in depth.

Although 'Vianne' is a stand-alone book it was enjoyed more by those who have read the rest of the series. They could see how Vianne's story develops and place how she is in the later books into context. For others this book did not entice them to read the rest. Our next meeting is June 8th at Caroline's

house and our book is something completely different- 'The Hiding Place' by Corrie Ten Boom.

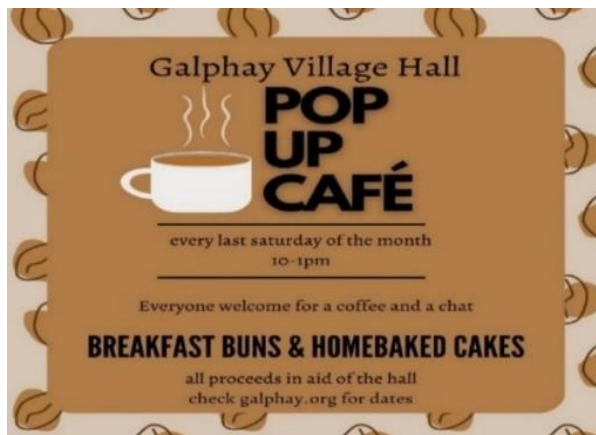
as well as dreams and goals. The deaf awareness badge has included signing using BSL and the guides spent time looking at wartime guiding.

KMLD GREEN TEAM EARLY SUMMER UPDATE

Our teams walking the local paths are noticing a variety of problems on our rights of way, and so far this year have done quite a bit of vegetation clearing and some replacements of posts and stiles. The group that surveyed the Kex Beck for the WaterBlitz project had a lovely walk, and reported that generally the beck is in good condition. We are reliant on developing a good relationship with farmers and landowners, so please try to keep to footpaths and bridleways when out enjoying the countryside. Problems caused by dogs off leads can be an issue generally, and particularly on farms, so we would encourage everyone to follow the rules here please (and note the law has recently changed). There are many young birds and animals around at this time of year, which are especially vulnerable.

We put forward proposals to the PC for some improvements to the conservation/ community benefit of Lamberts Quarry Community Woodland, and are delighted to have been awarded £1,000 by the PC towards the project. This area is already well used by local people and we feel that it offers a key opportunity for community involvement in conservation activities. The plan is to thin the woodland to benefit the oak trees, and create a new winding activity trail through part of the area. More on this in due course.
