Old dogs, new tricks?

The English language has so many sayings, which try to capture common wisdom. However, I often find them quite limiting, sometimes subtly discouraging us from expecting change in ourselves. So, the



phrase 'You can't change a leopard's spots' might cause us to think we could never become anything different from what we've become. To describe someone as 'a one-trick pony' is a pretty harsh way of implying that their skills are significantly limited. The phrase I rather like — and particularly like to disprove — is 'You can't teach an old dog new tricks'. Now that I'm a couple of years into my 60s, I'm reluctantly realising that I'm probably in my 'latter years' I guess that means I could be described as 'an old dog'!

One of the things I've really appreciated about semi-retirement has been having a bit more time to try out new things. Over the weekend, my wife, Jo, and I have been concreting in 4"x4" posts to repair a wobbly fence, and recementing paving slabs which failed to 'stick' first time. We're in the process of developing the garden in this church property, after years of relative neglect. I've recently taken on an allotment in Masham, and I'm struggling to know how to limit my 'project' ideas, and simply grow some food!

I've recently discovered the delights of all-grain brewing, using some second-hand kit bought on eBay — and finding that it's possible to brew fairly decent IPA, with friendly advice from a bunch of helpful commercial brewers. I'm delighted to discover that there are some other lads around here who'd also like to try their hand at brewing, and might be willing to form a 'men's shed' based on it.

Having somehow failed to dance for 25 years, despite Jo's encouragement to find a ballroom dancing class, a few persuasive conversations locally has resulted in a weekly dance class in Grewelthorpe. We're only a few lessons in, but I'm not the only one in the group really beginning to enjoy it! (There's still plenty of room.)

With my adult acting experience previously limited to playing a pantomime dame a couple of times years ago, it was a surprise to have been invited by Emily to join the cast of her 'All Those On Board' musical, which, this time last year, saw us performing seven shows in seven venues from East to West. I have to admit it was a very steep learning curve – learning lines, remembering the dance moves, and having the courage to sing in public. During the first few weeks of rehearsals, I really wondered what on earth I was doing there – surrounded by well-seasoned actors, who seemed to pick it all up much faster than me. Yet, in the end, we got there, and, I have to admit, it was one of the most enjoyable things I'd done in a long time! Hats off to Emily for pulling it all together so brilliantly!

Then, when Mike Harford-Cross started talking about this play he was writing, a historical 'murder mystery', based on the assassination of St Thomas a Becket, to be put on locally, in St Andrew's, Kirkby Malzeard, I was quietly intrigued. When he asked me to play a very angry King Henry II – the one who had either deliberately or inadvertently ordered Becket's death – I felt rather shocked. 'It'll only be a few lines', he said, by way of persuasion. A couple of professional actors from down South would be 'doing the heavy lifting', while the rest of us 'rude mechanicals' (as bit-part actors were once

known) would just have a few lines each, to pad it out! Little did any of us know, as we sat round the table in Mike and Liz's dining room on that first night of rehearsals, reading out our few lines, that this new production would take on a life of its own. None of us realised that, along with amazing professional skills from the support team (in terms of staging, lighting, music and costumes), we'd be playing to sell-out audiences on both nights, and raising significant money for both a children's cancer charity and St Andrew's itself. Mike's dream of getting 'more people into church' and of writing and producing an intriguing historical play had paid off, and some twenty very amateur actors discovered the pleasure of participating in something bigger than themselves, and building relationships between church and village along the way. And how many of us ever get to act alongside well-respected professionals, either? This 'old dog' certainly learned a few 'new tricks' along the way, and thoroughly enjoyed himself!

You may be wondering why I'm writing this stuff in my Ministry Team letter in The Fountain? Well, I guess it's my way of saying that *new* things don't have to be *scary*. Particularly as we get older, it's very easy to 'stick with what you know', and become rather fearful of anything that's just a bit different – although few of us would acknowledge that it's *fear* that holds us back. One of the things I've discovered over the last 40 years, since I first threw my lot in with Jesus Christ, and allowed his Holy Spirit to influence the decisions I was making, has been that God has consistently encouraged me to break out of my well-worn rut, and to try out new things. What's the worst that can happen? We might make ourselves look silly, and others may laugh at us for wanting God's Spirit to fill every part of our lives. Yet I've usually found that when I approach things with *enthusiasm* (from the Greek *en Theos*, 'in God' – or allowing God to be in it fully), things start to open up, and sometimes other people want to come on board as well.

We recently said a fond farewell to Ian and Helen, after several years of faithful ministry here in this benefice. Our prayers go with them for a long and happy retirement. Now we find ourselves in 'vacancy', that period in which we try to discern the shape of these parishes as we go forward. During this time, responsibility falls on the shoulders of our Churchwardens, all of whom are volunteers, supported by the Area Dean and Archdeacon; and, locally, by Liz, Adrian and myself, as the remaining members of the Ministry Team, and the PCCS. None of us are getting any younger, and there is a considerable amount of work involved in keeping a benefice like this going. So, you may discover some very modest changes to the frequency and style of our weekly services, given that, without lan, there are fewer of us to go round!

Many years ago, I was told that the Japanese character for 'change' consists of two characters written back-to-back – those for 'risk' and 'opportunity'. Yes, inevitably, whenever there's change in the air, there is risk. Society is changing, ever more quickly, it seems. The world is increasingly in a state of flux, where old certainties, like 'right' and 'wrong', seem to be up for grabs in a way that would have seemed unconscionable even a decade ago. But thankfully, we are all known, held, and loved by God – our compassionate God, who cared so much for us that he asked his Son to suffer, in our place, for all the stuff we'd got wrong – so that we wouldn't have to. And that same God invites us to call him 'Dad', 'Father'; and to confide in Him our deepest concerns and greatest delights. He longs for us not simply to grow old gracefully, but to go on exploring new things, to continue to discover new heights of joy with Him, whilst also finding him present with us in our deepest sorrows – even, perhaps especially, into our old age.

So, if things change a little round here, let's *not* fear it, but be ready to explore it; to be curious about it; and to ask ourselves the vital question, 'Where is God in this?' You know, we might just be surprised!

'Becket - A Medieval Murder Mystery'

On Thursday & Friday, 22nd & 23rd May, 12th Century St Andrew's Church, Kirkby Malzeard, was transformed into a creative theatre set for the première and second performance of Mike Harford-Cross' latest work: 'Becket – A Medieval Murder Mystery' – playing before sell-out audiences on both nights. Reviews have been positive, and profits from the production are being shared between the Childhood Eye Cancer Trust and St Andrew's restoration fund.

The 900-year-old St Andrew's Church was almost unrecognisable, with clever staging, full lighting rig, and mobile and realistic sound effects, the action taking place in a number of settings in England, France and Rome. The costumes were creative, as was the medieval-recipe fayre, served by members of the cast during the interval, accompanied by a group playing medieval music.

Formerly a local GP, and now a portrait artist and member of St Andrew's, Mike was looking for ways to bring church and community together. It seems that writing, producing and starring in a new play is a natural way to do so! After historical research, he chose to present a new slant on St Thomas a

Becket's murder in Canterbury Cathedral in AD1170. Members of the Kirkby Malzeard 'Mowbray Theatre Group' were joined by two nationally recognised professional actors, Turkish-born *Gamze Seber* and Mike's nephew, *Ben Elder*.

The story is introduced and narrated by Southwark-born *Ordvig*, a loveable and nervous Blackadder-style *Baldrick* character. He spends the second half of the play accompanying the Papal investigator, *Roger of Hovedean*, on his travels, and half-heartedly trying to avoid the attention of various women, both 'religious' and lay! *Roger* has been called to investigate the heinous murder, after an outburst from the irascible King Henry II prompts four of his knights to take matters into their own hands. The rest is history. A powerful final declaration of unrequited love-turned-hatred towards Thomas, from Henry's Queen Eleanor of Aquitaine, leaves the audience rather stunned, and questioning her motives and even a possible hand in his death. A rather sobering historical wrap-up concludes the piece, but is followed, thankfully, by a final 'call and response' between *Ordvig* and his various lady admirers, which enables the audience to leave smiling!

Fountains Book Club

Book Group did not meet in April so we had two books to discuss- 'A Month in the Country' by JL Carr and 'Instances of the Number Three' by Salley Vickers. The two books provoked polar opposite reactions in a number of the group.

'A Month in the Country' was unanimously enjoyed. It was a delightful wander through a month in the country through the life of a tradesperson who was uncovering a painting on a church wall. It was a gentle story depicting a lovely relationship between parishioners and the land, portraying a rural idyll that we looked back on wistfully with nostalgia. There were lots of interesting characters and the two main characters had a beautiful, endearing relationship. The author showed some lovely differences between 'church' and 'chapel' folk and they brought back fond memories of childhood and Sunday School trips. The only thing that stopped it being 5 stars was that some people were unhappy with the ending but highly recommend it for a beautifully written story and dose of nostalgia.

Moving onto 'Instances of the Number Three' and this provoked words such as 'loathed' and 'hated'- given we have previously read and enjoyed two books by Salley Vickers this was a very different reaction. In simple terms it looks at a variety of 'threes' in relationships, including a ghost. There was very little discussion about the book as people could not get past hating it. Not everybody disliked it quite so vehemently but they were not exactly positive about it and would rather not have read it, so I will leave it there as a 'to read or not to read, that is the question?' (The main character liked Shakespeare)

Next, we are reading 'Cold Comfort Farm' by Stella Gibbons. **Libbie Davies**



There have been far fewer lapwing and no birds nested in the top field and we missed them!

I have observed many more bees, both numbers and species and also flies, not the best news for everyone but I found a FANTASTIC fly which was Raphidia Notata that's a snake fly to you! These amazing creatures have an elongated prothorax or long neck and their heads move around like the predatory creatures they are feeding mainly on greenfly. Their sinuous movement is like a cobra searching for a victim to strike and well worth looking up on Wikipedia (or any other source).

It is a joy of having a garden that every year I discover something new in!
